Orangeburg County South Carolina Brownfield Sites Assessment

The James E. Clyburn University Transportation Center (JECUTC), a unit of South Carolina State University, a state land-grant institution, in collaboration with the Environmental Policy Institute (EPI) housed within JECUTC, proposes to conduct an assessment of the brownfield sites in Orangeburg County, South Carolina. The primary goal of this assessment is to collaborate with community stakeholders to identify how the sites may be sustainably redeveloped to promote public health, safety, economic activity, and the environment.

Community Need

Orangeburg County lies roughly in south central South Carolina. Its 2010 land area covered 1,106 square miles with an estimate of 83.6 persons per square mile (U.S. Census Bureau 2011). The Environmental Protection Agency "Cleanups In My Community" lists two brownfields sites, one on-scene coordinator (OSC) site, and three Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) sites within the County. (See Table 1.) To date, there are no current EPA assessments in the County.

Project Description

In addition to verifying and updating the six sites listed above, the project team proposes to catalog and update the listing of other sites of EPA interest, e.g., leaking underground storage tanks, pesticide producers, etc., and other sites identified by community stakeholders in Orangeburg County. These sites, once verified will be put into a geographic information system (GIS) that will show not only the physical address, but also the area of interest with overlays of the sensitive populations.

Using the above data and in collaboration with local officials and their representatives, the project team will work with stakeholders to identify appropriate activities to improve the natural environment, economy, and other social aspects around the sites. Chief among these activities will be the identification of the necessary funds to undertake these actions and future collaborations, including leveraging existing public and private sources.
