**\* NONRESIDENT STUDENTS**

The state law requires that all nonresident students pay out-of-state tuition. Students under twenty-one years of age may be considered residents of this state if it is the legal domicile of such student's parents or legal guardian; a student twenty-one years of age or older may be considered a legal resident of South Carolina if that person is domiciled in this state. The administration reserves the right, at the discretion of the Registrar's Office, to request that an individual student present an affidavit affirming legal residence.

### REFUND POLICY

Matriculation fee refunds will be made at the following rate: seventy-five percent (75%) for withdrawal, for any reason, within five days after the opening of the summer session. THIS WILL BE BASED UPON THE DATE THAT WRITTEN NOTIFICATION IS RECEIVED IN THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE. On the sixth day all fees will be considered as earned and no refunds will be allowed. Refunds of board charges will not be made for periods less than one week. Special fees are refundable only in instances where improperly or erroneously charged.

**AUDITING FEES:** One-half of the fee normally charged for the course when taken for credit.

**NONCREDIT:** Charges for courses taken for no credit will be the same as the charges for courses which are taken for credit. The dates for the Refund Cycle are determined by the Office of Financial Affairs and Management Information Systems.
